

TOWN OF UPLAND, INDIANA

APRIL 11, 2007

The Town Council of the Town of Upland met in regular session on the above date. Bonham was absent from the meeting. President Romine called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. There was a motion by Martz seconded by Cooper to approve the minutes from the March 28th meeting. Those voting aye: Jaggars, Romine, Cooper, Martz. Nays: No one.

UPLAND MAYTAG VILLAGE: Pam Bolen, owner of the Laundromat questioned why she was still being billed for water usage when she had asked that the service be taken out of their name on January 22nd. According to the Clerk and Town Manger they have been working with Bolen on the issue because there is still usage on the meter. Long is in question as to whether or not there is a leak. There was a motion by Cooper seconded by Jaggars to reimburse Bolen for the March and April billing since they had asked for the service to be taken out of their name. Those voting aye: Jaggars, Romine, Cooper, Martz. Nays: No one. Long will continue to look into the matter of a leak.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES OTHER THAN CARS: Resident Brad Thurman was at the meeting to ask if the town could adopt an ordinance allowing motorized vehicles other than cars (golf carts, 4 wheelers) to be allowed on the roadways. Marshal Parker and Town Attorney McKown will meet between now and the next meeting to discuss the issue.

SRF VISIT: Long reported that the SRF site visit for the water plant has been rescheduled for April 18th at 10 a.m.

TRIAD ASSOCIATES: Jim Frazell has been in contact with Long about setting up a meeting with the Council to close out this project and to talk about what can be done by them before the next project begins. It was decided by the Council that we would change their next meeting to April 24th. Their will be an Administrative meeting at 5:00 p.m. in order to meet with Triad and the regular meeting beginning at 7:00 p.m.

SPEED LIMIT ORDINANCE: McKown brought a copy of an ordinance for speed limits in town. He asked that Marshal Parker check it over for accuracy before the Council adopts.

UPLAND MEMORIAL PARK: Romine congratulated the Upland Memorial Park committee on their groundbreaking for the new park. He commented that fund raising was going well.

CAPACITY FEES: Romine asked the Council to continue to think about starting to charge residents building new homes a capacity fee since they will be adding to the load of the water and sewage plants.

Their being no further business, the meeting was adjourned. The next regular meeting will be Tuesday, April 24th at 7:00 p.m. There will be an Administrative meeting at 5:00 p.m.
