

TOWN OF UPLAND, INDIANA, SEPTEMBER 14, 2011

The Town Council of the Town of Upland met in regular session on the above date. All members were present. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Michael Cooper. There was a motion by Martz seconded by Jagers to approve the minutes from the August 24, 2011 meeting. Those voting aye: Bonham, Jagers, Cooper, Martz, Schwartz. Nays: No one.

FIELDCREST APARTMENTS: Phil Hardley, owner of Fieldcrest Apartments came to the meeting to inquire about a drainage problem on Catalina Drive. Before paving of the street, there used to be a "V" that directed surface water to a drain near Eighth Street. One of the units now has standing water in the summer and ice in the winter. Council asked Town Manager Long to look into the problem and make a recommendation for a resolution. Hardley also inquired about the new water main that had been installed on Catalina Drive. The work has seemed to stop but it is not complete. Long said that we are waiting on paperwork from test results. Mr. Hardley also asked if the drain near his home could have a bigger cover to alleviate clogging and water backing up into his yard. Long will also look into that matter.

HEAVENLY TOUCH CLEANING: A quote was submitted for bi-weekly cleaning of the Town Hall by Heavenly Touch Cleaning. The quote was for \$120.00 per month. Council will take under advisement.

GREENWAY MEETING: A meeting for the Greenway will be Thursday, September 15th at 7:00 p.m. at the Upland Lions Club.

VAN BUREN LIONS CLUB: Nancy Gore questioned the Town as to whether the Van Buren Lions Club was charged for setting up their tenderloin booth over Labor Day week-end. Clerk informed her that they made a donation to the town.

PARK BOARD MEETING: Nancy Gore asked the Council when the next Park Board meeting would be. She would like to attend.

PAVING: A quote was received from E & B Paving to pave Third Street from Berry to Wright for \$45,520.00 and to repair six street cuts in the amount of \$15,205.00. There was a motion by Jagers seconded by Schwartz to move forward with the paving as quoted. Those voting aye: Bonham, Jagers, Cooper, Martz, Schwartz. Nays: No one.

PLUNGE DAY: Long reported that Plunge Day had gone well. There were 450-500 kids involved and several projects were completed.

SECOND STREET BRIDGE: Bonham expressed a concern about several boards missing on the bridge. He recommended that the Council send a letter to the Commissioners. There was a motion by Bonham seconded by Martz to send a letter to the Commissioners requesting them to look at the bridge and give the town a report on condition and sturdiness of the bridge. Those voting aye: Bonham, Jagers, Cooper, Martz, Schwartz. Nays: No one.

TRICK OR TREAT HOURS: It was the consensus of the Council to set the Trick or Treat Hours for Saturday, October 29th from 6-8 p.m. This will coincide with Harvest Fest, Ambulance Bash and Poetry Reading.

TENDERLOIN DINNER: The Upland Chamber annual Tenderloin Fry will be Friday, September 16th from 4-7 p.m. at the Elementary School. Proceeds will be used to buy new appliances for the Upland Community Building.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned. The next regular meeting will be Wednesday, September 28th in the Upland Town Hall at 7:00 p.m. There will be an Executive Session at 6:00 p.m. for the purpose of discussing personnel.
